Summary:	Grant Opportunity – Gambling Community Benefit Fund (GCBF) Round 122 (Closing 30 November 2024)
Date:	26 <sup>th</sup> September 2024

The Gambling Community Benefit Fund Rd 122 is now open, closing midnight Saturday 30 November 2024.

Funding of up to \$35,000 is available for a wide variety of items, including community events/training; equipment (including medical equipment); facility improvements; machinery; printing/publications/marketing; solar; vehicles/boats; workshops/conferences.

Applications are prioritised by the GCBF Committee in the following order (1 has highest priority):

- 1. Items/facilities directly affected, damaged or destroyed by a declared natural disaster in the last two
- 2. Equipment or facility improvement
- 3. Buses, cars, caravans, boats, tractors, trailers, large mowers, motorbikes and similar items
- 4. Community events, training, workshops, festivals, publications and website development
- 5. Organisations that have received more than \$15,000 from GCBF within the last two years


## **KEY INFORMATION**

- Organisations may only have one application pending at a time, i.e. you cannot submit another application while you are awaiting the result of an application submitted in a previous round. No resubmits will be considered
- Organisations must wait a one round exclusion period after the acquittal has been accepted by the department and the grant is considered closed. For example, your application was closed by the department on 12 September, you can't apply in the current funding round, however, you can apply in the next round, which will likely close end of February 2024 (TBC)
- The GCBF Committee also considers the following when deciding how to distribute funding:
  - Financial position of the organisation
  - Age of the organisation
  - Value for money
  - Other contributions (financially or in-kind) towards the items
  - Whether the organisation can generate income
  - Benefits to more than one organisation
  - Number of applications by the same sponsor

- Location of the organisation and benefits to the region
- Target group that's being assisted
- Government priorities identified by the Minister.
- Organisations must update and review their registration details annually and every time they apply. Failure to do so, will deem the application ineligible. This includes:
  - Current financial position must be taken from financial statements within last two years
  - Updated contact details for all persons registered with the organisation in the portal
  - Multiple quotes are required; quotes are not required to be submitted with the application but may be requested later
- NOT ELIGIBLE: operational costs, wages, food, uniforms, petrol, internal training not delivered by a third
  party, items purchased by overseas supplier, equipment where a deposit has already been paid (this will
  be considered retrospective)
