

Summary:	Grant Opportunity – Sunshine Coast Council Minor Grant Program (Closing 28 October 2024)			
Date:	8 <sup>th</sup> October 2024			

The <u>Sunshine Coast Council Minor Grants</u> Program is now open, closing **28 October 2024**. The Minor Grant Program supports not-for-profit organisations to deliver one-off projects, events and activities with broad community benefit.

Funding up to \$2,000 is available for projects meeting one or more of the relevant priorities in the following categories:

- **Community Development:** Community-led projects that contribute to enhancing community wellbeing and/or strengthen the ability of community organisations to respond to community needs
- Community Facilities: Infrastructure projects that involve the development, maintenance or improvement of buildings or land that contribute to providing a safe, accessible and inclusive community facility
- Creative Development: Projects that strengthen the creative ecology of the Sunshine Coast
- **Cultural Heritage:** Projects that document, conserve, promote and make accessible the region's heritage and social history (Note: Applicants must discuss their project with a council Cultural Heritage Officer prior to submitting their application)
- **Economic Development:** Projects contribute positively to improve the economic performance and prosperity of their local community
- **Sport and Recreation:** Projects and programs that promote community participation in sport and recreational pursuits



## **Key points:**

- Applicants must have acquitted all previous Council grants prior to applying
- Higher priority is given to projects that reduce environmental impact and/or provide energy, water and waste efficiencies; build skills/capacity of community groups; activate places and spaces; procure from local businesses, social enterprises and/or First Nations businesses; budget to procure a Welcome to Country by the Traditional Custodians of the Sunshine Coast (the Kabi Kabi peoples or Jinibara peoples)
- Applicants that have been awarded a Minor or Major grant in the past twelve months or are applying for a project/event which has previously been funded under these grants, will be considered lower priorities for funding
