INTRODUCTION

The 2025 QLD Pool Rescue Championships attracts competitors from Queensland, providing an opportunity to unite over two days showcasing one of Queensland's most iconic volunteer movements, Surf Life Saving.

This year's event will be held at Gold Coast Aquatic Centre, Southport on 12th & 13th July 2025.

This document outlines some key information relating to the 2025 QLD Pool Rescue Championships. Please note that SLSQ may have subsequent bulletins or circulars which may supersede information provided in the circular.

COMPETITION COMMITTEE

The Competition Committee (CC) will direct all matters relating to the actual conduct of the competition.

The CC may, in accordance with the rules contained in the current edition - *Surf Sports Manual*, any subsequent amending bulletins and this circular, postpone, cancel and or alter any or all events at the Championships, and/or alter the venue of the competition.

The CC may consult and seek advice from appropriate officials, athletes and other personnel on competition conditions and safety issues when required. The CC shall appoint the various sub committees and panels as required for the event e.g. Disciplinary Committee & Coach/Athlete Panel.

The Chair of the Committee shall be the Safety & Emergency Management Coordinator who shall also be a member of the Competition Committee. The composition of the SEC will be determined by SLSQ.

DISTRIBUTION OF BULLETIN

It is most important that the information in this Bulletin is brought to the attention of all Carnival Officials, Team Managers, Coaches and Competitors.

Non-receipt of the Circular will not be taken as an excuse if a Club, Team or individual does not comply with the requirements outlines in this and other Bulletins and Circulars.

ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE

All competitors wishing to compete at the 2025 QLD Pool Rescue Championships must be current financial and proficient members of a Surf Life Saving Club. Members must hold the required age award as required for competition.

Age groups will be as per the 2024/25 season.

All competitors must have completed the minimum 25 hours of beach patrol (or pro rata of hours as per the current SLSQ Patrol Operations manual).

ENTRY REGISTRATIONS

Club entries to the 2025 QLD Pool Rescue Championships is via SEMS.

Clubs can submit seeding times by emailing the SLSQ Sports Administrator, Karen Degnan – kdegnian@lifesaving.com.au

Entries for this event close at midnight on Monday 7th July 2025.

Late Entries Close at 9.00am on Wednesday 9th July 2025. No entries will be accepted after this date.

ENTRY FEES

The entry fee per competitor will be \$37.50 (Inc. GST).

All entry feels will be payable after the event by invoice to the competing club.

Late entries will be \$87.50 (\$37.50 entry fee plus \$50.00 late entry fee)

EVENT RULES

The 2025 QLD Pool Rescue Championships will be conducted under the rules as published in the relevant sections of SLSA's Surf Sports Manual and the ILS Competition Manual plus any subsequent bulletins or circulars.

The eligibility conditions for age categories, substitution, and other required provisions to compete are also provided for in the SLSA Surf Sports Manual and subsequent bulletins or circulars.

Please be aware that all competitors in the tow events will need a handler. If a handler is not in position when the starter is ready, the competitor may be disqualified.

Age Determination and Restrictions

Members must be aged 10 years or older as at 30 September 2024 and be currently proficient in their relevant age award in order to be eligible to compete in individual events at the Championships.

U10 members may compete in U11 team events only (eg. Patient Tow, Line Throw, Medley Relay, Obstacle Relay & Brick Relay)

A competitor's age group is determined by their age as at midnight on 30th September 2024. For example, a member who is aged 13 years on the 30 September 2024 is eligible to compete in the U14 age group.

Two Person Relays

Patient Tow

- U10s may compete in an U11 team only
- U11s may compete in U11 or U12/13 team events only
- U12s may compete in U12/U13 team events only
- U13s may compete in U12/U13 team events only

Note: Competitors stepping up age groups to make up a team cannot represent 100% of the members in that team. For example, two U11 athletes cannot step up to do the U12 line throw/patient tow together.

Line Throw

- U10s may compete in U11 team events only
- U11s may compete in U11 and/or U12 team events only
- U12s may compete in U12 and/or U13 team events only
- U13s may compete in U13 and/or U14 team events only
- U14s may compete in U14 and/or U15 team events only
- U15s may compete in U15 and/or U17 team events only
- U17s may compete in U17 and/or U19/Open team events only (can only do 2 of 3)
- U19 may compete in U19 and/or open team events only
- Open may compete in Open team events only
- Masters may compete in Masters and/or Open team events only.

Note: Competitors stepping up age groups to make up a team cannot represent 100% of the members in that team. For example, two U11 athletes cannot step up to do the U12 line throw/patient tow together.

Note: U14 can compete in U15 only if they hold their SRC

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Note: U15 can compete in U17 only if they hold their bronze

Four Person Relays

- U10s may compete in U11 team events only
- U11s may compete in U11 and U12/13 team events
- U12s may compete in U12/U13 and U14/15 team events
- U13s may compete in U12/13 and U14/U15 team events
- U14s may compete in U14/15 and U17/U19 team events
- U15s may compete in U14/15 and U17/U19 team events
- U17 may compete in U17/19 and open team events
- U19 may compete in U17/19 and open team events
- Open may compete in Open team events
- Masters may compete in Masters or Open team events

Note: Competitors stepping up age groups to make up a team cannot represent 100% of the members in that team. For example, two U11 athletes cannot step up to do the U12 line throw/patient tow together.

Note: A Relay Team must have a minimum of 50% of the competitors who are from the correct age group

Where there are specific age group events for both male and female teams, there are to be **NO** mixed gender teams to be entered or allowed to compete.

EVENT EQUIPMENT

SLSQ will supply the Rescue Tubes, Obstacles, Ropes, Bricks & Manikins for the use of competitors during competition. All competitors are required to supply their own fins.

All equipment must comply with the ILS specifications as specified in the ILS Sports Manual section 11. Competition equipment will be subject to random scrutineering checks during the event.

SLSQ equipment will not be made available for training prior to or during the event due to losses incurred in the past. Competitors or teams found to be in possession of SLSQ equipment outside the competition may be referred for disciplinary action.

Event Equipment and Specifications

All competitors are required to supply their own swimwear, fins, and caps. The swimwear and caps must comply with the SLSA specifications as specified within the current edition SLSA Surf Sports Manual.

The swim fins used by U14 to masters competitors must comply with the specifications as detailed in the Sections 2 and 4 of the current edition SLSA Surf Sports Manual. These specifications are identical with ILS specifications.

The swim fins used in events for U13 and under aged events are restricted to soft/flexible rubber type fins used for swimming training similar to the styles depicted below:



Please note that fins that do not meet this general profile or are specific purpose diving or surfing/bodyboarding fins and/or with stiff and/or elongated blades, will not be permitted for use in U13 and under aged events.

The swim fins shall comply with the following dimensions:

- Maximum 50cm overall length including the shoe.
- Maximum 25cm width at the widest point of the blade.

Swim fins are to be measured with the shoe or ankle strap extended but not stretched. Swim fins will not be permitted to be used if they do not conform to the specifications or if they are considered to be safety hazard.

Note: Fins are measured while not being worn.

Please note that fins that do not meet this general profile or are dedicated dive fins and those with stiff and/or elongated blades will not be permitted for use U13 and under aged events.”

The obstacles, manikins, line throw ropes, rescue tubes etc. will comply with ILS specifications and shall be provided by SLSQ for the competition. The specifications for this equipment may be found in Section 10 of the ILS Competition Manual.

The rubber bricks to be used in the U11, U12 and U13 50m Brick Carry events have the following specifications:

Measurements: 230mm x 80mm x 80mm

Weight: 3.5kg



The bricks will be available through SLSA's Shop (refer: <http://www.sls.com.au/shop>) or at some specialised sport stores or swim shops.

SLSQ shall supply the bricks to be used in competition.

DRESS OF COMPETITORS

In all events, competitors must wear approved competition dress as detailed in the current edition of the Surf Sports Manual and any other subsequent Bulletins or Circulars.

SLSQ staff, the Event Referee, Area Referee and/or Sectional Referee reserve the right to order the removal or covering of signage, ID, or logos in conflict with any event sponsors and/or the SLSA Competition Sponsorship Policy.

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EVENT MEDALS, TROPHIES & POINTSCORE

SLSQ Championship medals will be awarded to individuals and team members gaining 1st (Gold), 2nd (Silver) or 3rd (Bronze) in all Championship events contested.

Overall Pointscore (1st, 2nd & 3rd) trophies for the top 3 clubs in each will be awarded at the conclusion of the event.

The point score awarded to each Champion Club, within each event's age category, will be 6 points for 1st place, down to 1 point for 6th place. If, when the event has concluded, there is a tied pointscore, the club with the most first places will be declared the winner. Failing this, the club with the most 2nd placings to 6th placings respectively will be considered to determine a tie and dual trophies will be presented.

Note: International clubs (and/or non SLSA affiliated clubs) are not eligible to earn points towards the overall pointscores.

DEAD HEATS – Where a dead heat (as defined in the current edition of the Surf Sports Manual) occurs in the final of an event, the clubs of individuals/teams will share the placing points and medal relative to the finish placing. The club of the next individuals/teams to finish will receive the relative placing points based on the number of individuals/teams finishing ahead of them. For example: if two individuals finish equal 1st, both individuals/teams shall receive 6 points each and the gold medal. The next placing individual/team shall be awarded the 4 points and the bronze medal for coming 3rd.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITOR MEDALS – If an international competitor (or club team) place (1st, 2nd or 3rd) in a Championship they will be awarded the medal equal to the placing gained.

However, the Australian competitor/s (or club team/s) to who place will be awarded the QLD Championship Title/Placing and the equivalent medal.

OFFICIALS

All appointed officials will be required to be current accredited SLSA officials and be the holder of a current BlueCard. If an official would like to nominate for this event please follow the below link.

Nominations must be received by Wednesday 2nd July 2025.

It is imperative that the appearance of competition officials/judges is of a high standard, therefore appointed officials are asked to give a high degree of attention to their quality of uniform.

It is preferred that all officials wear the generic white and blue officials' shirt.

POOL SETTERS / FIRST AID

For the 2025 State Pool Rescue Championships SLSQ will be placing a roster on clubs to provide members to assist with the Pool setting of the equipment required to complete each of the events. This roster will cover Saturday afternoon starting with event 55 through until the completion of competition at event 86. On Sunday the roster will cover from 87 through until event 134.

SLSQ asks that clubs ensure any members that are put forward are capable swimmers who will be able to assist with the placement of manikins and bricks on the bottom of the pool which is a depth of 2 meters and requires a reasonable fitness level.

SLSQ is also looking for a volunteer or multiple volunteers to be placed as First Aid personnel for the event. This is a new requirement from Gold Coast Aquatic that when organisations hold events at the complex, they must have their own first aid personnel and not rely on the actual Lifeguards that are on duty. The lifeguards will assist in any major incident, but any minor injury will then be dealt with by the event first aid personnel.

These members would be included in the club's official ratio for the event.

Pool Setting requirements would be as per below:

Saturday PM

4 Members are required in the water to assist with placement of manikins.

2 Members are required to assist in towing manikins back for event 55 to event 62.

Sunday AM

6 Members are required in the water to assist with placement of bricks and manikins.

2 Members are required to assist in towing manikins back for event 87 to event 134.

Clubs are asked to submit names to fulfil the above roles to rbennett@lifesaving.com.au with a preference of day.

TEAM MANAGERS

Each club must have a Team Manager complete the online [TEAM MANAGER DECLARATION LINK](#) before their club is eligible to compete at this event.

Team Managers must ensure they complete the above online Team Managers Declaration for this event by Monday 7th July 2025.

It is the Team Managers responsibility to ensure the changes to the Club's competing teams have been registered with the appropriate officials, and that all their competitors are correctly entered in the event.

It is compulsory for all Team Managers (in their official roles) to wear clearly identifiable apparel that highlights their club name and the wording 'Team Manager'. Anyone not displaying this ID will be asked to leave the competition area.

TIMEKEEPERS

All clubs competing at the 2025 QLD Pool Rescue Championships must be prepared to provide at least 2 timekeepers. The timekeepers do not need to be accredited officials. The more timekeepers you can provide the less time they will have to be on the pool deck however clubs will need to be responsible for any rotation in personnel ensuring each new time keeper reports to the Chief Timekeeper prior to taking up their position. **Timekeepers should be available from 30 minutes prior to the commencement of competition.**

SCRUTINEERING

Scrutineering at this event will be conducted randomly throughout this event by appointed scrutineering officials.

MEDIA & PHOTOGRAPHY

For the safety of competitors, officials and spectators SLSQ prohibits the use of drones or Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAV) at this event by members and/or public unless approved by SLSQ, 7 days prior to the event.

The operator must supply an operations manual (including risk management plan), provide a copy of public

liability insurance and comply with all Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) requirements. SLSQ may utilise the use of our own drones to conduct aerial surveillance and monitor hazards.

Photography:

As a condition of entry, all competitors agree to have photos and video taken during the event used for promotional material by SLSQ.

Photographers within the carnival area must have a visible photographer's pass as well as their BlueCard.

HEALTH & WELLBEING

The welfare of all competitors and officials is of paramount importance and athletes or their Parent/guardian in the case of underage competitors should seek advice prior to the competition from a qualified professional for any health concerns if required.

Any competitor or official who suffers illness or injury prior to or at the event must seek a medical clearance before resuming their normal activities which includes training and competition.

In addition, SLSQ may, at its sole discretion, require a competitor and/or official to be assessed for physical and/or psychological fitness to participate in the competition. This ensures the safety and wellbeing of the athlete concerned and fellow competitors while also ensuring all parties and SLSQ are not placed at risk.

SLSQ will be supplying adequate shade tents at all marshalling areas for officials and competitors throughout the event. It is highly recommended that all athletes ensure they carry with them adequate apparel to assist with reduction of sunburn, along with recommended use of sunscreen throughout the day.

COMPETITION MANIPULATION AND ANTI-DOPING

Competition Manipulation

The SLSA National Policy on Competition Manipulation and framework covers all SLS Events that are conducted by SLSA, State Centres, Branches and Clubs, special events conducted by third parties sanctioned by an SLS entity and any event, competition or series connected with surf lifesaving. Please refer to SLSA 5.11 – Competition Manipulation and Gambling Policy for further details.

It is strongly recommended that all coaches, team managers and support personnel complete Sport Integrity Australia's Competition Manipulation & Gambling online course.

Anti-Doping

Members have responsibilities under the SLSA 5.02 Anti-Doping Policy and SLSA 6.23 Improper Use of Drugs and Medicine in Sport Policy (available on the SLSA Members Area). All team members are encouraged to develop their knowledge and understanding of Anti-Doping by accessing Sport Integrity Australia (SIA) online courses.

It is recommended that all athletes, coaches, team managers and support personnel complete the Sport Integrity Australia's "Clean Sport 101" online course. It is strongly recommended that all coaches, team managers & support personnel complete the SIA Anti-Doping Fundamentals online course.

BEHAVIOUR/MISCONDUCT

Any misconduct while at the event will not be tolerated. This includes the days leading into the competition and any official social activities following the conclusion of the event. Offending members risk disciplinary action against both themselves and their Clubs.

Please refer to the Surf Sports Manual sections *2.27 SLSA Code of Behaviour* and *2.28 Abuse/Inappropriate Behaviour* and the Policy *6.5 Member Protection Policy* (available online at the Members Portal).

PROTESTS

All protests shall be lodged with the appropriate Liaison Officer in each Area in accordance with procedures set down in the current edition of the Surf Sports Manual and any subsequent bulletins, and shall identify the specific sections/clauses in the Competition Manual and or event rules upon which the protest is based.

Protest Forms are available from the Liaison Officer. An 'Appeals Fee' of \$110 must accompany all documentation when the process is officially submitted to the Appeals Committee for adjudication.

STATE TEAM SELECTION
