- **Resource Management:** Managing patrols across multiple locations requires strategic planning and active volunteer participation.

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Enhancing Member Engagement

- **Social Connections:** Activities that connect younger and older members foster camaraderie and retention.
- **Recognition:** Celebrating member achievements reinforces motivation and highlights the club's impact.
- **Feedback Systems:** Annual surveys help identify areas for improvement, ensuring the club evolves to meet members' needs.
