- Provide necessary information to the club so they can provide any accommodations or supports that may be needed.
- Seek advice and recommendations from fellow parents, caregivers, or the club's leadership to identify suitable opportunities tailored to your child's/dependent's requirements.
- Explore the available resources within the surf lifesaving community to gain insights and tips to enhance your child's/dependent's experience.
- Familiarise yourself with the club's welfare policies and guidelines to ensure a comprehensive understanding of the club's approach to inclusivity.
- Take necessary steps outlined within the club's procedures in case of any perceived instances of discrimination or unfair treatment.
