Strategies for Retention & Engagement

- **Enjoyment Factor:** Making officiating enjoyable increases long-term participation.
- Youth Involvement: Engaging younger members through fun and social connections helps sustain interest.
- **Flexibility:** Officials should be informed that they can watch their children compete when needed.
- **Quota Considerations:** Proposing adjustments to include probationary officials outside of club quotas can reduce pressure on others.

Actionable Steps for Clubs & Officials

- Educate clubs on the full-day commitment required for carnivals.
- **Encourage** new officials to ask questions and seek mentorship.
- **Clarify** the hierarchy and decision-making process in pre-carnival briefings.
- **Develop** strategies to engage younger members in officiating.
- Facilitate ongoing training and mentorship opportunities.
